Applied and medical anthropology. Evolutionary theory and natural selection. Basics of contemporary genetics. Forensic anthropology and identification of remains. Anthropological critique of the race concept. Microevolution and macroevolution. Genetics and origins of modern human. Consequences of domestication, cultivation and sedentism. Anthropological definitions of culture. Ethnographic methods and production of anthropological knowledge. Language, culture and thought. Symbolic practices. Myth and ritual. Kinship.
